JOIN US AS WE SEEK TO:

Achieve and maintain Ag-Friendly Tax Policy

- Extend the Tax Cuts and Job's Act provisions that help agriculture beyond 2025 including:
 - Preservation of federal transfer tax lifetime exemption amounts,
 - indexed for inflation, and retention of step-up basis under §1014, and
 - Return to 100% bonus depreciation under § 168, and
 - · Continued expanded application of § 179, and
- Maintenance of §199A qualified business income deduction. Increase the aggregate limit allowed under § 2023A to \$30 million, indeed for inflation.

Make Risk Management Tools More Effective

- Increase the Livestock Risk Protection subsidy level, and
- Allow Livestock Risk Protection overage to start the day price risk assumed and
- Create or improve mechanisms for industry and oversight of risk management tools that will make them more attractive to producers.

Improve Access to Labor

- Increase the Livestock Risk Protection subsidy level, and
- Create optimized and efficient process for workers in good standing to return to the same employer year after year, and
- Redefine "agricultural employer" to expand its scope for purposes of H-2A programs to include more employers essential to agricultural production in the United States.

Increase Flexibility for Livestock Haulers

- Exempt livestock haulers form Hours-of0SErvices rules, and
- Permanently exempt livestock hauls from the Electronic logging Device
- Support the state and federal adoption of increase load capacity limits.

Create Support for Young and Emerging Livestock Producers

- Reform USDA programs to raise limits of guaranteed loan programs, streamline the lending process, and expand eligibility criteria.
- Create tax credits or incentives for leasing or selling land to, and providing capital to, younger or emerging livestock producers, including elimination of capital gains, reduced financing costs, and access to loans.
- Create front-loaded tax relief for buyers purchasing land for use in livestock production.
- Establish programs and educational programming to cultivate interest in young people to pursue careers in livestock production. Incentivize livestock producers and others, including those in academia, business, and government, to mentor young or emerging livestock producers and into the industry. Develop technologies targeted at increasing efficiency in livestock production.
